Ann Davison has served as the Seattle City Attorney since winning election in a stunning upset for Republicans in 2021.


Davison actually won endorsement from two former Democrat governors and one former Republican governor. Her opponent in the race for Seattle City Attorney was highly vocal in calling for the abolition of police.

While Davison was once a Democrat, she has been associated with the WalkAway campaign, which is a movement of Democrats-turned-Republicans.

Committed to a public safety platform, Davison has worked to reduce the 5,000-criminal-case backlog in Seattle. Her no-nonsense and efficient approach was very desirable during an election taking place after the "Summer of Love" fiasco of violent protests in Seattle.

Part of Davison's strategy was to dismiss roughly 2,000 cases and focus on repeat offenders. Her goal was to use the court system to intervene in their lives to end recidivism.

In addition to cleaning up the backlog she inherited, Davison is a committed advocate for victims' rights.
