- 5636 -- Expanding automatic voter registration, possibly without proper safeguards (Hunt)
- <u>5665/5727</u> Making unreasonable demands on land use to "preserve salmon" Governor's "land grab" (Rolfes)
- <u>5735</u> "Bueller Bill" = Allowing up to 20% of instruction time be asynchronous and without contact with the teacher (Dhingra)
- 5766 -- Preserving a pregnant individual's ability to access abortion (Randall)
- <u>5843</u> Making it a gross misdemeanor for a public official or candidate for public office to lie about elections (Frockt)

### The Bad House bills that died in Senate

- 1117 Revising the state's comprehensive planning framework (Lekanoff)

## The Ugly

- Inslee budget provision: Providing \$628,000 to "expand voting while incarcerated"
- 1692 Eliminating drive-by shootings as a cause for elevating a murder charge to aggravated murder (Simmons)
- <u>5036</u> Allowing child rapists and murders, including those sentenced to life in prison and those convicted of capital murder, to apply for a shorter prison sentence (Dhingra)
- <u>5633</u> Requiring 1 million acres of land be conserved/reforested by 2040 another "land grab" (Rolfes)
- <u>5665/5727</u> Making unreasonable demands on land use to "preserve salmon" Governor's "land grab" (Rolfes)
- <u>5735</u> "Bueller Bill" Allowing up to 20% of instruction time be asynchronous and without contact with the teacher (Dhingra)
- <u>5751/1868</u> Improving worker safety and patient care in health care facilities by addressing staffing needs, overtime, meal and rest breaks, and enforcement (Robinson/Riccelli)
