# Dynamic bills advanced by Senate Republicans

- <u>SB 5004:</u> Adds panic buttons to the school emergency response system (Torres)
- <u>SB 5033:</u> Sampling and testing of biosolids (Wilson, J.)
- <u>SB 5036:</u> Annual reporting of state emissions data (Boehnke)
- <u>SB 5079:</u> Permitting DSHS to **not** pursue overpayments to aged, blind, or disabled assistance program beneficiaries because the state was spending more on the process of collecting the overpayments than the amount collected. (Muzzall)
- <u>SB 5124:</u> Network adequacy for skilled nursing facilities (Difficult to Discharge) already passed Ways & Means (Muzzall)
- SB 5165: Increases indirect compensation for damage from deer and elk (Short)
- SB 5200: Medical foster homes for veterans (Wagoner)
- <u>SB 5268:</u> Unlawful possession of a firearm (Wagoner)
- <u>SB 5317:</u> Compliance between local governments and the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council (Boehnke)
- <u>SB 5358:</u> Expanding technical education to the 6<sup>th</sup> grade (Braun)
- <u>SB 5408:</u> Allows employers 14-day window to cure errors related to a job posting before a lawsuit (King)
- <u>SB 5672:</u> Improving the home-care aide certification process (Muzzall)

# Harmful bills that Senate Republicans opposed

- <u>SB 5041</u>: Providing unemployment benefits for striking workers. (Riccelli)
- <u>SB 5083</u>: Reference-based pricing (Robinson)
- <u>SB 5098:</u> Banning law-abiding citizens from exercising the Second Amendment rights in additional locations (Valdez)
- <u>SB 5181:</u> Gutting the Parents Bill of Rights adopted just last year through a people's initiative to the legislature (Wilson, C.)
- <u>SB 5123:</u> Expanding the list of DEI categories that apply to Washington's public schools (Nobles)
- <u>SB 5179:</u> Allowing OSPI to go after schools/officials who don't comply with the Democrat majority's ideological agenda. (Wilson, C.)
- SB 5284: Extended producer responsibility in solid waste management (Lovelett)
- <u>SB 5296:</u> Revising sentencing for juvenile offenses and shifting the cost for juvenile rehabilitation onto locals. (Wilson, C.)
- SB 5375: Violating the First Amendment rights of members of clergy. (Frame)
- <u>SB 5466:</u> Eminent domain authority for electric transmission lines (Shewmake)
- <u>SB 5589</u>: Biased study bill that would require the Office of the Insurance Commissioner study "rate factors that may have disparate impacts on Washington residents" in a way that adheres to the bill's language, which presupposes an outcome. (Hasegawa)

- <u>SB 5060:</u> Law enforcement hiring grants (Holy)
- <u>SB 5075:</u> Reducing and eliminating cost-sharing for prenatal and postnatal care (Muzzall)
- <u>SB 5091:</u> Delinking Washington vehicle emissions standards from California (Boehnke)
- <u>SB 5144:</u> State tortious action report (Gildon)
- <u>SB 5207:</u> Directs electronic media services to provide pro-rated refunds when a customer cancels their subscription to the service early. (MacEwen)
- SB 5208: Clean energy fund program (MacEwen)
- SB 5213: Making knowing possession of fentanyl a felony (McCune)
- SB 5229: Requiring assisted outpatient treatment after multiple Narcan revivals (Wagoner)
- SB 5237: Unattended child in vehicle (Muzzall)
- SB 5250: Squatters (Wilson, J.)
- SB 5258: Addressing concurrent enrollment in Medicaid (Gildon)
- SB 5260: Allowing youth to voluntarily transfer from DCYF custody to DOC. (Christian)
- SB 5267: Death penalty for killing a DOC worker (Wagoner)
- <u>SB 5283:</u> Prohibiting Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council from preempting local laws for siting (Wagoner)
- SB 5305: Salmon recovery accelerator (Muzzall)
- SB <u>5347/5348</u>: Organized retail theft (Fortunato)
- <u>SB 5371:</u> Removes the restriction on 24-litre per transaction limit on alcohol sales to retailers (MacEwen)
- <u>SB 5399</u>: Requires LCB to make decisions on liquor license applications within 45 days; 30-day extension with good cause (Schoesler)
- <u>SB 5434:</u> Reforming the governor's emergency powers to allow more legislative oversight (Wagoner)
- <u>SB 5487:</u> "Ag Overtime" Allowing 12 weeks during a year where agriculture workers can work 50 hours a week before overtime kicks in (King)
- <u>SB 5499</u>: Recodifying the highly effective body scanner program at a handful of facilities operated by the Department of Corrections. (Christian)
- SB 5530: Increased penalties for drug-related property offenses (Fortunato)
- <u>SB 5535:</u> Reaffirming the right to bear arms and declaring any law that ban a particular firearm or attributes liability to firearm industry member as unconstitutional. (Fortunato)





- <u>SB 5566:</u> Increasing the penalties for assault of a law enforcement officer (McCune)
- <u>SB 5630:</u> Continuing Climate Commitment Act payments to support exempt farm fuel users (Dozier)
- <u>SB 5642:</u> Improving performance on maternal health and women's cancer screenings for Medicaid clients (Torres)
- <u>SB 5736:</u> Establishing a chronic child neglect review system to improve how DCYF handles abuse and neglect cases. (Braun)

# Bad policies that Republicans were able to stop

- SB 5038: Clarifying and expanding those offenses considered as hate crime offenses (Dhingra)
- <u>SB 5062</u>: Reducing the availability of affordable childcare by increasing unnecessary regulation of childcare facilities. (Saldana)
- <u>SB 5066:</u> Permitting harassment of law enforcement officers by allowing the Attorney General to sue law enforcement agencies (Hansen)
- <u>SB 5099:</u> Targeting legal firearms dealers (Lovick)
- <u>SB 5133:</u> Allowing certain parents and guardians to get reduced sentences for child abuse and child neglect offenses. (Wilson, C.)
- <u>SB 5140:</u> Increasing the burdens on law-abiding citizens who wish to purchase a firearm. (Liias)
- <u>SB 5180:</u> Changes the transgender student policy and procedures to make schools more "gender inclusive" (Wilson, C.)
- <u>SB 5185</u>: Alternative pathways to practice for international medical graduates (Saldana)
- <u>SB 5205:</u> Unconstitutional bill violating freedom of religion by targeting the hiring practices of private, faith-based universities. (Conway)
- <u>SB 5254:</u> Allowing trial attorneys broader access to patient medical records to increase the ability to sue (Orwall)
- <u>SB 5266</u>: Eliminating the 20-yr waiting period for individuals sentenced as juveniles to petition for release, even when convicted of violent crimes, including murder and rape (Frame)
- <u>SB 5269</u>: Allowing felons to petition for resentencing after serving 10 years of their -- doesn't apply to murderers, and providing money for psychotherapy for those felons to deal with the trauma of their crime and resentencing (Frame)
- <u>SB 5312:</u> Reducing the length of sentences and sex-offender registration for those convicted after being caught in "net nanny" stings (Wellman)
- SB 5321: Providing the abortion pill to students at public higher education institutions. (Nobles)
- SB 5364: Unconstitutional changes to authority of elected sheriffs (Lovick)
- <u>SB 5382:</u> The "Initiative Killer" Threatening signature gatherers for initiatives with fines and jail time if certain requirements aren't met. (Valdez)
- <u>SB 5387:</u> Interfering with right of Washingtonians to seek alternative medical services (Robinson)
- SB 5502: Bottle Tax (Robinson)
- SB 5578: \$25-per-hour minimum wage and other labor standards (Saldana)
- <u>SB 5583:</u> 38% increase in hunting and fishing license fees (Liias)







- <u>SB 5584:</u> Creation of a new government agency whose sole purpose is to find a cop to prosecute for murder (Dhingra)
- <u>SB 5593:</u> Levy equalization (Wellman)
- SB 5626: Wage replace/unemployment insurance for undocumented workers (Saldana)
- <u>SB 5652</u>: Requiring port districts to adopt environmental justice plans (Orwall)
- SB 5696: Municipal gas utility compliance under the Climate Commitment Act (Ramos)
- <u>SB 5715</u>: Entitling adults convicted of felony offenses to petition for shorter sentences solely on the basis of also being convicted of felony offenses as a juvenile (Kauffman)
- SJR 8200/ SB 5186: Had to pass together
  - o <u>8200:</u> Increasing property taxes by removing 60% vote needed for school bonds and lowering it to a simple majority (94% con testimony in committee) (Cortes)
  - o <u>5186:</u> Removes school facilities for which impact fees may be collected, lowering the threshold to 50%. (Krishnadasan)
