  - [8200](#): Increasing property taxes by removing 60% vote needed for school bonds and lowering it to a simple majority (94% con testimony in committee) (**Cortes**)
  - [5186](#): Removes school facilities for which impact fees may be collected, lowering the threshold to 50%. (**Krishnadasan**)
